



About Lake Oswego, Oregon

Lake Oswego is nestled on the banks of the Willamette River in Northwest Oregon, eight miles south of Portland, the states largest city. Nearby are some of Oregon's most popular attractions including Mount Hood, the Pacific coast, and the Columbia River Gorge. Built around a 405 acre lake, Lake Oswego has a population of 34,300, covers 10 square miles, and is consistently rated as one of the region's most livable cities. It is noted for it's excellent school system, has a superb library, an outstanding senior citizen center, a heavily used community arts facility, and an expansive parks and natural areas system.



Lake Oswego schools are recognized throughout the state for its high standards and prestigious schools. The Lake Oswego School District enjoys strong support from community members, parents, students, teachers, and staff. Residents place a high premium on quality education for their children, and support their schools accordingly.

About 30 percent of Lake Oswego's residents live in Mountain Park, an area characterized by its planned mix of private homes, condominiums, and apartments.
